





Abantu Mu Buntu and Tender Talents School

Talented 14 – 18 year old Ugandan performers attending Tender Talents School present spellbinding tribal dances, drumming, songs, music, and folktales from their home in East Africa. Audiences not only enjoy watching these amazing young performers, but always are inspired by their irresistible joy and spirit.

Tender Talents is a school for children aged 12 to 18 in Kasangati, near Kampala. Set up in 1999 by Frank and Brenda Katoola (who will be on tour with the group), it offers a rigorous academic curriculum along with special arts training in cultural dance, music, drama, visual art and sculpting.

Many of the school's pupils come from the poorest section of the community. A high proportion have lost parents and other family members to AIDS, some come from single-parent families, others are refugees from the Northern Conflict (a regional war that rumbled on for over a decade). The school receives no direct state funding but relies on donations, bartering, and fees from those parents who can afford to pay.

Creative Connections

As part of Creative Connections' annual two week International Young Performers' Tour, Abantu Mu Buntu will be visiting 15 schools in our area, performing and giving cultural workshops to 5000 students and their teachers. Founded in 1992, Creative Connections is a non-profit international education organization headquartered in Norwalk, CT.
