

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing.


The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon.



This year marks the 48th anniversary of the Person-to-Person Dove Box Program, which is enthusiastically supported by area churches. Dove boxes provide holiday food to families and seniors in need in our community, while also giving individuals and families the opportunity to share their blessings with their neighbors at Christmas. This is a wonderful opportunity to help your children understand the joy of giving during the Christmas season. Participation is open to anyone and may involve preparing a wrapped carton of food or can be as simple as making a direct donation to families/adults through Person to Person.

Parishioners wishing to participate need only select a White or Green Dove on any **Sunday after Service**, follow directions printed on it and bring joy into another home this Season.

White Dove: Fill 1-2 identical reusable bags with food and love for Christmas Day! (No boxes this year) All necessary food items and directions are on the reverse side of the Dove. A \$15.00 contribution is required so Person-to-Person can purchase a supermarket gift card for each family to buy their own choice of meat. Fill in the back dove with your name, address & telephone number and return it (along with the \$15.00) to either Annette Madden-Kline or Gayle Appleby of the Board of Outreach (details below)

Green Dove: A financial contribution to Person-to-Person's Scholarship or Emergency Assistance Fund. Scholarship will enable eager students to continue their education. Emergency Assistance Fund will help someone with a fuel bill, rent or a medical bill not covered by Medicaid. Please mail your financial contribution directly to Person-to Person.

Bring the spirit of Christmas into your heart at the annual Candlelight Concert at The First Congregational Church of Darien on Sunday, December 11th, at 7:00 pm.

The evening will feature performances by **The Darien High School Tudor Singers** under the direction of Chris Andrade, **the church's Senior Choir soloists**, **world-class pianist Max Pakhomov** and **a carol sing-along** by the audience. Refreshments will follow the program.

There is no charge for the concert. A free-will offering will be taken to benefit the Shelter for the Homeless (Pacific House), which assures that some of the poorest and most vulnerable members of our community have respite from living on the streets, a hardship which is both dehumanizing and dangerous. Operating for 30 years, this is the only regional shelter in lower Fairfield County serving the four-town area of Stamford, Darien, Greenwich and New Canaan. The shelter typically houses 60 to 85 men, and up to 110 during extreme weather months. Its doors are open 365 days a year, 24 hours a day.
